- Mona Garvey and Beyond! North Dakota's master of public relations, Darrel Hildebrand (children's librarian at Bismarck Veterans Memorial Library) will present not only what can be done in North Dakota, but what has been done to motivate the public to "think libraries."
- Little Trustees, Come Blow Your Horn! Visual aspects of how small and medium sized libraries are keeping the public's interest and awareness. Bring your slides, pictures, posters, bookmarks, newspaper articles and anything else your library has done or is doing! Do you have projects in the works? Come share your pride and ideas with us! SECOND ANNUAL TRUSTEE SCHOOL

The second annual Trustee School will be held Saturday, April 30th, in Bismarck at the State Library and in the Senate Chambers. As the State Library did last year, we will again pay 10¢/mile round trip and lunch for two people from each board to come to the school. And we will pay for overnight lodging, dinner and breakfast for two people on each board if they are at least 150 miles from Bismarck. The program will be from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and will include the following:

- 1. Library Trustees Who Are We?
- 2. North Dakota Library Law Introduction and familiarization of library law from Section 40-38 to State Aid to Libraries.
- 3. Library Budget and Budget Planning Program budgeting, zero based, line item.
- 4. Overview of North Dakota Libraries A look at geography, services and types of libraries throughout North Dakota Also, Network for Knowledge, Advisory Council on Libraries, and the North Dakota Library Association.
- 5. Services and Tour of State Library Registration forms and a more detailed program will be coming late in March.

STATE LEGISLATION

A great big "Thank You!" to all of you in the library community who have called, written and visited your legislators concerning Senate Bill 2012, the State Library Appropriations bill. As of March 1, the bill has passed the Senate without cuts in the Governor's recommendation. SB-2012 is currently in the House Appropriations Committee. I'd especially like to thank the trustees and librarians who have testified and/or attended the two committee hearings. Your testimony and presence at these hearings have made it clear to the Legislature that the North Dakota library community works together to bring library service to all North Dakotans.

* * * * *

LEGISLATIVE DOCUMENTS

The Legislative Assembly, Legislative Council, and the State Library cooperatively sponsored the distribution of all North Dakota House of Representatives and Senate Bills and Resolutions to thirty libraries across the state this year. Along with the bills and resolutions, a bill status report and the daily House of Representatives and Senate Journals were sent to the thirty The Legislative Assembly paid for libraries. the UPS distribution to the libraries. Legislative Council librarian, Marilyn Guttromson and State Library personnel, Ruth Mahan and Mary Braaten, conducted workshops in December for librarians on the use of these materials. Workshops were held in Bismarck, Minot, Grand Forks and Fargo. The thirty libraries that have been receiving the documents were those that indicated an interest in the program in response to a questionnaire sent to them last Spring. A survey inviting comments on the program will be mailed to the participating libraries at the end of the legislative session. The following libraries received the documents: Bottineau County, Devils Lake, Bowman, Ellendale, Griggs County, Harvey, Rugby, Kidder County, Linton, Mandan, Minot, Valley City, Bismarck, Dickinson College, Minot College, NDSU-Bottineau, Standing Rock (Ft. Yates), Research Center (Mandan), Rolla Hospital, State Hospital (Jamestown), Grand Forks, NDSU, UND, Mayville College, UND-Williston, Valley City College, School of Science, Film Library (Fargo), UND Law Library, Veterans Hospital.

STATE AID TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES

The 1981 Legislature appropriated \$1.1 million for State Aid to Public Libraries for the 1982/1983 biennium. In fiscal year 1983 the last half (\$550,000) was distributed in two checks: December, 1982 and March, 1983. Formula for distribution is: city libraries -\$1 per capita; county libraries - \$1 per capita plus \$5 per square mile. Eligibility requirements include maintaining required mill levy and proper library board. State Aid money is spent primarily for books, magazines and reference materials, followed by keeping the library open more hours; audiovisual materials, building maintenance, and supplies. For some libraries State Aid money constituted one-half to three-fourths of their book budget. A Loss of State Aid would severely hamper collection growth.

TECHNOLOGY TASK FORCE

The Technology Task Force Committee met with Hank Epstein, a library networking consultant from Madison, Wisconsin, on February 2 and 3 at the Veterans Memorial Library in Bismarck. He has developed a technology awareness workshop which he presented to the committee. Committee members are attempting to develop a system which will allow all libraries to directly access the state's library collections. The present system allows libraries with OCLC to locate materials, but OCLC is thus far limited to larger libraries and since all OCLC libraries do not have their total collections in the system, it further limits the access that is potentially possible. Mr. Epstein is in the process of writing a report to the committee that will outline alternatives to OCLC for smaller libraries. His report will be duplicated and distributed to all public and academic library directors for their perusal. An informational meeting entertaining feedback from the directors regarding the report will be held later this spring. Committee members are: Ruth Mahan, State Librarian, Tom Jones, Veterans Memorial Library, Bismarck, Dick Barton, NDSU, Fargo; Ed Warner, UND, Grand Forks; Ted Giese, Minot State College; Dave Boilard, UND, Grand Forks; Harry Belgarde, Turtle Mountain Community School, Belcourt; Marilyn Guttromson, Legislative Council, Bismarck; and Mary Braaten, State Library, Bismarck.

MAIL -ORDER CATALOG

The State Library, in cooperation with Grand Forks Public Library, has initiated a program designed to bring books into approximately 11,800 households throughout the state. A mail-order book service is now available to residents of ten rural North Dakota counties. In late January a catalog listing 435 paperback book titles was mailed out to residents of the following counties: Benson, Billings, Burke, Dunn, Grant, Oliver, Sargent, Sheridan, Slope, and Steele. Included in the catalog are books of popular fiction, humor, biographies, self-help and religion. There are also listings for young adults and children. People wishing to receive books send their requests to the Grand Forks Public Library, where the Mail-Order Library is located. The Grand Forks staff processes the requests and mails the books to the patrons, who can keep the books for four weeks. The patron then mails the books back, along with a new order. The response to the service has been enthusiastic, to say the least! In the first three weeks of the program, 409 people requested material. This put a strain on the supply, so more books are being acquired to keep up with the demand. We knew there were some eager readers out there! We'll do our best to fill their needs!

North Dakota enrollments in the "Talking Book" program increased by 24% in 1982. A lot of that increase is due to the outreach work done by librarians throughout the state. On January 1, 1982, there were 950 patrons of "Talking Books," on January 1, 1983, that figure had increased to 1,177. This

During the same period of time, circulation of bocks increased by 10% and circulation of magazines and newsletters increased by a whopping 106%! * BIGGEST BOOK

Super Book was published in 1976 in Denver, Colorado. Measuring 9 feet x 10 feet 2 1/8 inches, it is 300 pages long and weighs 557 lbs.

* SMALLEST BOOK

Ari (The Ant) was published in Tokyo, Japan in 1980. It has 20 pages and measures 1/18 x 1/18 inches.

* OLDEST AUTHOR

Alice Pollock of Surrey, England was 102 years 8 months old when her book **Portrait of My Victorian Youth** was published in 1971.

* YOUNGEST AUTHOR

When she was 4 years old, Dorothy Straight of Washington, D.C. wrote a book entitled **How the World Began**. It was published by Pantheon Books in 1964.

* AMAZING READER

Lyle Koehler of Cataract, Wisconsin read over 500 books in 1963 and repeated the feat in 1964. In one week he read 19 books and in one month 70½. Books averaged 300 pages.

* FAST READER

Thurman Wade of Wilmington, California was clocked reading 6,200 words a minute. He scored 90 to 100 percent in comprehension tests on what he had read.
