

## Fine-Free Resource

Library fines were previously considered a deterrent to late returns, damage, or loss of items. However, fines can also be a significant barrier that prevents users from accessing the resources of a public library and doesn't necessarily act as the intended deterrent. The Ontario Library Association has created a customizable infographic template to calculate the hidden costs of fines -- such as staff time, processing, and postage for overdue notices -- to assist libraries and their boards in deciding whether the time has come to go fine-free. 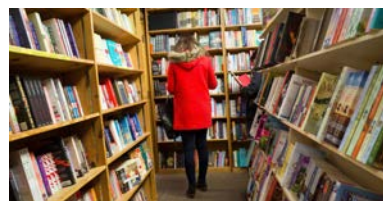

Finally, they will discuss the good and the bad and note areas where practices can be improved to help **you** avoid pitfalls in advance when planning remote programs!

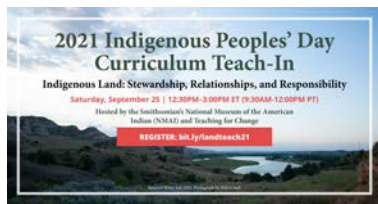
