NDSL Kit of the Month

Cozmo

The State Library offers a variety of kits for checkout—STEM, robot, NASA, outdoor, storytime, book club, and display kits are all available. Kits are a popular program at libraries of all types for both passive and active programs.

The Cozmo Robot kit is a small, artificially intelligent, programmable robot with personality, facial recognition, and a penchant for playing games. Users can use the three included cubes to play games, train, and do tricks with Cozmo. To learn more about this kit and NDSL's other available STEM kits, visit the **STEM Kit LibGuide**.



This kit is recommended for ages 8+ and requires a compatible device running at least iOS 9, Android 5 (Lollipop), or Fire OS 5. A full list of compatible devices can be found on the **Anki support website**.

The Cozmo Robot Kit comes with six Cozmo Robot cases. Each case includes one Cozmo Robot, three Power Cubes, one Charging Station, and charging adaptors for each robot along with a Quick Start Guide, Overview, Coding Challenges and Solutions, Inventory, and a statistics sheet.

Kits can be checked out for eight weeks and reserved up to one year in advance. No more than three kits can be checked out at one time. This kit can only be checked out to libraries and educational institutions and are not for individual circulation. Kits for schools or classroom use need to be checked out by the Library Media Specialist. To see when this kit is next available, check out KitKeeper.



Material and Decorative Displays

For Week 16 of my Teaching Tidbit, I am going to keep things light. Today's topic is displays in the library! Whether you love to create displays, or they are a task you would much rather pass off to others, book and decorative displays do add interest to a library space. Additionally, they can bring materials to the attention of students and staff, especially items that tend to otherwise be lost in the shelves. (On that note, one of my favorite displays is "Forgotten Books," where materials that have not

been checked out for quite some time are displayed. Some titles become winners with patrons; others end up heading towards the weeding pile.)

Things to Keep in Mind with Book Displays

Mainelibraries.org (n.d.) highlights things to keep in mind when creating displays:

- 1. Books displays should reflect your patrons' interests and not your personal interests. This is not to say you should not use displays to introduce your students and staff to new things. Instead, make sure "new concepts" are tied into current learners' curiosities. For example, if your students are highly interested in manga, place some nonfiction books about Japan and Japanese culture in the exhibit.
- 2. Use attractive and easy-to-read signage, but make sure the materials for checkout are the primary focus. A main goal of displays entails increasing circulation. You want the students to really "see" the volumes instead of just the pretty background.


Read Across America

Read Across America was March 2 nd. However, feel free to celebrate throughout National Reading Month in March.


